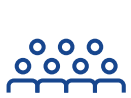


The School

Founded in 1952, we are a coeducational, college-preparatory Christian school serving ages 6 weeks–grade 12 in the heart of east Memphis. We are known for our rigorous academics, arts and athletic offerings, and racial diversity. We have 42 full and part-time upper school faculty members, 55% of whom hold an advanced degree. Facilities include classroom buildings, two computer labs, a 1500-seat auditorium, a microfarm, a learning lab, a library, and an extensive athletic complex (3 gymnasiums, weight room, fields, and courts).

AP Program

We offer nine Advanced Placement (AP) courses on campus across English, science, math, and foreign languages, giving students the opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school. We also offer AP courses online through Ethos. With small class sizes and individualized teacher support, our AP program equips students to think critically, manage academic rigor, and excel on national AP exams.

Lunch Program

Belltower Coffeehouse provides our school lunches. Parents have access to an online prepayment system to make payments and monitor their students' selections. Students may also bring lunches from home.

Technology

An iPad is issued to each student in grades 9–12. We have two computer labs and provide a wireless network. Commonly used apps and sites are Canvas, FACTS, IXL, and library databases.

GPA and Class Rank

Grade point average is cumulative. For the purpose of ranking in class only, extra quality points are added for honors (0.5), dual enrollment (1) and AP (1) courses when the student makes a C- or higher. If a student enters Harding with high school credits from another school, courses and grades are added to their Harding transcript and included in the cumulative grade point average. Transcripts from previous schools will be provided with our transcripts.
