

## SPANISH III, Honors SUMMER WORK



This summer practice is designed to help you start Spanish 3 feeling confident and ready to go! Since students often forget some Spanish over a long summer break, it is much more helpful to spread the work out over the summer instead of completing everything at the last minute.

You will:

- Read a shortened 4-chapter version of *Don Quijote de la Mancha* and answer multiple-choice questions for each chapter on Flango (Netflix style reading website).
  - Instructions for creating an account are on the second page.
  - For each chapter, you should also:
    - Write down at least 10 important or new vocabulary words
    - Write a short summary in your own Spanish
- Watch 5 videos on Edpuzzle:
  - 2 videos about *Don Quijote de la Mancha*
  - 3 additional videos to help improve your listening comprehension skills

This assignment is due by 11:59 PM on the first day of class. Late assignments will lose one letter grade for each day they are late.

At the beginning of the school year, we will discuss *Don Quijote de la Mancha* together and read another version of the story in class.
